AGA President

Dear Members of the Alabama Golf Association.

It is my distinct honor to address you as President of the Alabama Golf Association (AGA). I am profoundly grateful for the privilege of serving this distinguished organization and for the opportunity to represent our dedicated staff, volunteers, and more than 33,000 members across 123 member clubs throughout the state. To advocate on behalf of those who so passionately support the game of golf in Alabama is among the greatest honors of my career in the sport.

Reflecting upon the past year, there is much to celebrate. We witnessed a milestone in AGA history with the first Men's State Amateur Championship hosted by an RTJ Trail facility, where Bailey Sutter earned a coveted USGA Golden Ticket. Only two weeks later, Rawlin Sutter prevailed through challenging weather conditions to capture a second AGA title for the Sutter family in 2025. On the women's side, Scarlett Schremmer triumphed over Gabi Nicastro in a thrilling playoff to claim the Women's State Amateur Championship title at RTJ Grand National.

Beyond our state borders, Alabama golfers continued to distinguish themselves on both regional and national stages, with numerous competitors qualifying for USGA Championships. Among the most remarkable achievements of 2025 was Team Alabama's victory in the Southeastern Challenge Match—its first in 34 years. These accomplishments bring well-deserved recognition to our players and reaffirm the depth of talent and strength of the game within our state.

A continued cornerstone of the AGA's success lies in the delivery of our core services—GHIN handicapping, course rating administration, championship qualifying, and educational programming in partnership with the USGA. The AGA staff and Board of Directors have worked diligently to enhance the member experience and broaden the scope of opportunities available through membership.

Our Foundation remains steadfast in its mission to foster the growth and sustainability of golf through initiatives such as Junior Golf Alabama, Youth on Course, college scholarships, and turfgrass research. In alignment with this mission, I am pleased to announce the forthcoming launch of USNDP Team Alabama next fall. This new program will provide our state's most promising young golfers with opportunities for enhanced player development, mentorship, and competitive preparation both on and off the course.

Looking ahead, the AGA is proud to present a robust schedule of championships designed to serve players of all ages and abilities at some of Alabama's finest facilities. Among the highlights of the upcoming competitive season are:

- 110th Alabama Men's State Amateur Championship Country Club of Birmingham
- 94th Alabama Women's State Amateur Championship Cider Ridge Golf Course
- 81st Alabama Boys State Junior Championship Valley Hill Country Club
- 63rd Alabama Girls State Junior Championship Anniston Country Club



Each of these championships will once again provide the opportunity for winners to advance to their respective USGA National Championships. There has never been a more exciting time to be part of the Alabama Golf Association, and I encourage all members to explore the many benefits and programs available at alabamagolf.org.






Since 1980, the AGA has managed the affairs of the Southern Golf Association which includes conducting the historic Southern Amateur Championship and Southern Junior Championship.




