NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

The Rules of Golf as approved by the USGA and R&A effective January 1, 2019 and the local rules on both this sheet and Terms of the Competition govern play at this AGA Championship. Disregard local rules printed on the club scorecard.

FORMAT

54 holes stroke play, 18 daily for Stroke Play and Senior Championship. 36 holes stroke play, 18 daily for Super-Senior Championship. Low Scorer from the Championship Division will be the Champion. As noted in the entry form, if a play-off is necessary to determine a winner for any Championship it will be a sudden death play-off on holes TBD.

TRANSPORTATION AND CADDIES

- a) Caddies are allowed at this Championship. Pull/Push Carts are allowed
- b) Caddies may ride with the player during the play of the hole only if the caddie and player are from the same household. (i.e. parent, sibling, spouse). If not from the same household, the caddie must walk at all times.

REPLACEMENT OF BROKEN OR SIGNIFICANTLY DAMAGED CLUBS

Model Local Rule G-9 is in effect

BUNKERS, FLAGSTICKS AND HOLE INSERTS

- a) Bunker rakes will be provided to each player on their golf cart.
- b) Flagsticks must always remain in the hole. Touching of and removal of flagstick violations will be enforced by the AGA Code of Conduct
- c) Foam inserts will be set in the hole to allow for a ball to come to rest in the hole to assist with minimizing player contact with the hole. If a ball hits the foam insert and comes out of the hole it is not considered holed.

OBSTRUCTIONS

Stone drains attached to paths are part of the cart path.

OUT OF BOUNDS

Defined by the line between course-side points, at ground level of white stakes, white dots, curbs of all public roads, white irrigation flags right of #15 green, fence left of #7 and fence surrounding maintenance area.

PRACTICE

- a) Practice areas will not be available for use after the round and use is strictly prohibited. This will be enforced by the AGA Code of Conduct.

GENERAL

- a) Tees: Stroke Play Championship Division - Red AGA Tees
Stroke Play Tournament Division - Blue AGA Tees
Senior Championship Division - Blue AGA Tees
Senior Tournament Division - White USGA Tees
Super-Senior Championship - White USGA Tees
- b) Players must go to the scoring area in the clubhouse dining room to certify scores immediately following completion of the round.
- c) **PACE OF PLAY** See separate Pace of Play Policy on the Terms of the Competition and scorecard for specific pace times.
- d) Weather Evacuation Plan: In the event of a suspension for a dangerous situation, all players must return to the clubhouse immediately following the horn. Players may be asked to go to personal vehicle during suspension.
- e) Rulings: Call AGA Rules Phone at 303-931-2621 and a rules official will be dispatched to your location as soon as possible
- f) Shelters are located: #5 Green, #12 Tee, #15 Tee
- g) Rules Committee: Andy Priest, Adam Powell, Brian Scheufler, Jeremy Gardner

COURSE MEASUREMENTS

1. Hole locations are measured from the front of the green along the line of play from the center of the fairway or teeing ground.
2. Yardage Adjust (i.e. +22) is the yardage to add to any yardage indicators, i.e. sprinkler heads or permanent markers.
3. Yardage on scorecards are to center of the green. Yardage on sprinkler heads on course are to the front of the green.
