

The third round of play did not result in any change in the tournament leader. Even though Widener slipped to a 75 he was still the leader by 1 stroke over Moss and 2 strokes over Langham and Brian Craig of Gastonia, NC. Craig's 5 under par 67 was the lowest score recorded in the third round. Still in striking distance were 8 additional players all within 4 strokes of Widener.

The final round provided some excellent play and many exciting moments. The five top finishers all had sub-par rounds on this great but difficult course. The low score of this group was the 68 posted by Johnston which gained the 2nd place finish for him — 1 stroke behind Widener whose final round 71 earned him the winner's spot at 283.

Jason Widener is an excellent player and is no stranger in the Southern Amateur competition. He also was the winner of the 1989 Southern Amateur Championship and thus he becomes only the third person during the past 76 years to become a repeat winner. We look forward to having Jason defend his title again in 1991 in the play of the 85th Annual Southern Amateur Championship at the Country Club of Birmingham in Birmingham, Alabama.

The Bob Jones Trophy is awarded annually to each member of the low team consisting of the four low players from the same state, based on the first 36 holes of play. The state of North Carolina was the winner in 1990 with a total team score of 592. This winning score was the result of performances by Jason Widener, Greensboro at 137; Mike Goodes, Reidsville at 139; Neal Sullivan, Kitty Hawk at 144 and Andrew Anderson, Arden at 145.

The Dogwood Course, Country Club of North Carolina, is truly a magnificent course and has served as the site of several prestigious amateur events including the 1980 U.S. Amateur Championship and 4 Southern Amateur Championships in 1971, 1979, 1985 and 1990. Although there is no question that the course proved to be a difficult challenge, the excellent playing conditions presented a delightful and interesting experience to the very talented field of contestants.

The cooperation and assistance received from Buck Adams, Golf Professional; George Thompson, Golf Course Superintendent; and Jim Horn, General Manager — and their respective staffs — were outstanding and contributed much to the tremendous success of the 84th Southern Amateur Championship.
